MINUTES FOR REGULAR MEETING MONDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2016

Chairman Pisano called the Meeting Regular Meeting of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority to order at 7:05 PM and makes the following announcement:

I hereby announce that pursuant to Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, that adequate notice of this meeting has been sent to the Asbury Park Press and is on the BRSA Official Website. Notice has also been sent to the Clerks of Aberdeen, Hazlet, Holmdel, Keansburg, Keyport, Matawan, Union Beach and Marlboro and the Western Monmouth Utilities Authority. This notice is also posted in the lobby of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority Administration Building.

Chairman Pisano asked all in attendance to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence for the safety of US Troops all over the world.

REPORTS

Executive Directors Report, BRSA Projects, Special Reports & Connection Applications Mr. Fischer Reported:

Headworks Odor Control System

• Manuel Ponte of R3M conducted a study to identify what the odors are and where the odors were coming from and alternatives to rectify the problem. Manuel Ponte is prepared to present a proposal to design the Headworks Odor Control System.

Manuel reviewed his findings and plans to rehabilitate the System at the approx. cost of \$363,000, engineering design costs \$45,521 with a six month completion date.

Disaster Recovery

- The Niro Incinerator has been running since last month and is running good. We are putting more sludge in it to a point we are running out of sludge to where the tanks are empty. This will help with the odor and the liquid returning to the front of the plant.
- The Stack Test was conducted October 17 & 18 without the Mercury Scrubber. Discussions were held with CPPE (the Mercury Scrubber manufacturer) and we asked for a report on root core analysis & protective measures we can put here at Bayshore to prevent against the "heating types of incidences". Our engineers are reviewing their reports and we should hear back from them shortly.
- Remsco Contracting 73S- have been working on fire alarms, termination of wire runs and flood gates for Return Sludge Bldg. then they will start on the punch list.
- Shorelands Construction rebuilding a couple of pumps and working on punch list.
 Of all three projects, Niro has the most work left at 95% complete.
- Combined Blower Building Project mussel wall has been built around building #1 and work on Blower Building #2 is in progress
- Power Distribution Project received approval from the DEP to advertise went in newspaper November 7th for the receipt of bids on December 14th. Hope to have award at the December 19th meeting. This is the last of the big 5 projects and the only project that is 100% funded by FEMA. NIRO 55% because of upgrades and Blower Building 75% defuser upgrades.

Disaster Funding

- Stone Hill Construction submitted payment application #17 in the amount of \$465,371.62, Remco Contracting submitted payment application #13 in the amount of \$223,700.30 and payment #14 in the amount of \$95,596.06. Shorelands did not get a payment application in on time.
- The combined project payments excluding November totals \$21,455,685.62. Construction costs are 89% of that amount, engineering costs are 10%, administrative costs are .05% and NJEIT Technical fee is .05%. FEMA reimbursable stands at 61% or \$13,170,433.26.

2017 Budget

• The 2017 Budget has been sent down to the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services. We are awaiting their certification and a Public Hearing is scheduled on December 19th prior to our Regular Meeting.

Other:

O'Brien & Gere licensed Site Remediation Specialist did an investigation involving that was detected in the ground by Main Pump Station back when we were cleaning up and closing out the oil leak. 1,1 DCE detection was just above limit so we had to do two more tests and the results were just above the limit. We had to enter into a more focused Ground Water investigation where five holes were dug around the location. Those tests were undetected so to wrap this up they are going to do a site survey, review records and talk to employees. It looks like it was a single incident during expansion or possible from a parts cleaner. It's contained to one spot and nowhere else.

Power Distribution System - BRSA needed a Land Use Permit because of the modification under the Conservation Restriction when the plant expanded in 1990. The switch gear line up is being built in a previously identified location. The Conservation Restriction is a deed that shows areas that are restricted from building. DEP reviewed our request to modify the Conservation Restriction and waive the restriction against locating the switch gear on previously restricted area and they have waived the switch gear restriction

but we still have to revise the Conservation Restriction. The Authority will eventually be responsible for enhancing/improving other restricted areas on site with native plantings.

Staff Engineer Report Pete Canal Reported:

Pete introduced Ed Barboe and John Wojnas from Hazen and Sawyer to explain the Change Order #5 submitted by Stone Hill Construction – Contract 74S - in the amount not to exceed \$350,661. Of that amount \$319,851.00 is FEMA reimbursable.

Chairman Pisano asked if FEMA has already approved the amount of the Change Order. John said yes they have.

Mr. Fischer explained that FEMA has allowed change orders but will handle them at close-out. Other issues discussed by Mr. Canal included:

- Award Contract 96 Primary Clarifiers 1 & 2 to low bidder-RB Welding in the amount of \$407,950, bids reviewed by BRSA staff and legal attorney award to lower bidder.
- Award Contract 90 West Keansburg Pump Station Odor & Corrosion Control to lower bidder Eagle Construction Services in the amount of \$869,514 bids reviewed by BRSA staff and legal attorney award to lower bidder.
- To extend 1 year Contract for Caustic Soda (Sodium Hydroxide) to Kuehne Chemical Co. under the same terms, conditions and price as the original bid.
- To approve the Final contract Change Order No. 1 to Modern Group in the amount of \$1,620.
- To award proposal submitted by R3M Engineering, Inc. for the design of the Headworks Odor Control System in the amount of \$45,521.
- There are two resolutions on the Agenda for Aberdeen Family LP for a sewer connection, TWA and Developers Agreement. They have been back and forth about wanting the Developers Agreement and decided to pay in full. The connection and TWA will be on the Agenda next month.
- To release the payment bond for Plaza Station, Atlantic Avenue in Aberdeen, paid in full
- Award Contract 81S Power Distribution Improvements & Mitigation Amendment No. 1 to HDR in the amount not to exceed \$5,875.
- Award Contract 81S- PS&S Conservation Restriction Permit Modification proposal in the amount not to exceed \$20,500.
- Award Contract 81S- HDR Construction Management & Inspection Services to HDR in the amount not to exceed \$632,250. NJEIT requires engineer to be present during the project to provide resident engineering service. This proposal was discussed with the Engineering Committee prior to the Board Meeting.

Consulting Engineer – R3M

Manuel Ponte Reported:

- Shorelands Construction- Various Buildings is complete except for three pumps that are in the scope to be repaired
- Standby Generator waiting for paperwork to close out.
- Met with BRSA staff to review finding and to discuss scope, means and methods the internal inspection of the West Keansburg Force Main by Pure Technologies while force main remains in service.

Superintendent's Report Mike Broyles Reported:

- Treatment Plant flow still historically low, barely hit 6 mgd for the month.
- Effluent quality slightly improved from last month, making adjustments due to use of only one plant
- Sludge Removal-first 10 days was the Dorr Oliver Incinerator and the remainder of the month was the NIRO.
- We had 6 Odor Control Complaints- all from 1 or 2 neighbors resealed the fiberglass covers with tarps and continue to explore and treat different areas.
- The NIRO has been running great. Staff has received training from the manufacturer and all have been involved in the running of the incinerator.
- DEP said the Efficiency Samples were tested and received an acceptable results and no further action is required.
- IPP three IFF and one CEI IPP draft permit were sent out and they have thirty days to make any comments. There were no significant changes to the permits except for the DEP's new language about the new Emergency Plan. This plan is for the users to come up with in case the Authority has an emergency and cannot take the flow. The industries have a year to have a back-up plan.

Chairman Pisano asked Mike about this months odor calls. Mike said he has one less than last month.

WHEREAS, Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority provides its employees with dental benefits through Delta Dental, and

WHEREAS, in January 19, 2017 the contract will expire and the "Authority" and Kuehne Chemical mutually agreed to extend the original Contract which will require authorization from the Commissioners and the completion of contract extension documents for the period January 19, 2017 to January 19, 2018; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Local Public Contracts Law, the Authority re-advertised for West Keansburg Pumping Station Odor and Corrosion Control Improvements Project, Contract 90 and five (5) sealed bid were received and publically opened on November 3, 2016 at 2pm EST, ranging in price from a low of \$869,514 to a high of \$1,184,173; and

WHEREAS, the Authority Attorney, Consulting Engineer, Gannett Fleming and staff, have reviewed the bids and recommend award to the lowest responsive responsible bidder, Eagle Construction Services, Inc. in the amount of \$869,514; and

WHEREAS, funds are available for this project.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Local Public Contract Law, Modern Group Power Systems was awarded Contract No. 83, Standby Generator Service, Repair and Appurtenant Work in the amount of \$296,832 by Resolution No. 101/15; and

WHEREAS, during the rehabilitation work it was necessary to perform additional services beyond the scope of work, including but not limited to replacing the batteries for Generator 1, which increased the contract allowance item by \$1,620; and

WHEREAS, R3m Engineering, Inc. and the BRSA staff have reviewed Final Change Order No.1 and find it to be fair and reasonable; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority approve Final Change Order No.1 for Modern Group Power Systems of Bristol, PA, in amount of \$1,620, increasing the contract amount from \$296,832 to \$298,452.

WHEREAS, through Resolution No. 95/16, the Authority contracted with R3m Engineering, Inc. (R3m) to analyze the effectiveness of the current odor control system to adequately remove odors from the headworks areas, and

WHEREAS, R3m completed its analysis and submitted a report on Evaluation of Improvements for Headworks Odor Control System #1, dated October 2016 with recommendations for improvements, and WHEREAS, R3m submitted an engineering design services proposal dated November 18, 2016 for

Improvements to Odor Control System No. 1, in the amount of \$45,521, and

WHEREAS, the BRSA Engineer and Director have met with the staff of R3m to review the proposal and find it to be fair and reasonable, and

WHEREAS, funds are available for this purpose.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority hereby approve engineering design services proposal for Improvements to Odor Control System No. 1, in the amount of \$45,521 to R3m Engineering, Inc. of Old Bridge, NJ in accordance with the terms and conditions of its proposal dated November 18, 2016.
