MINUTES REGULAR MEETING MONDAY, MAY 23, 2016

At 7:04 P.M. on Monday, May 23, 2016 Secretary Khachaturian called the meeting of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority to order and makes the following announcement:

I hereby announce that pursuant to Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, that adequate notice of this meeting has been sent to the Asbury Park Press and is on the BRSA Official Website. Notice has also been sent to the Clerks of Aberdeen, Hazlet, Holmdel, Keansburg, Keyport, Matawan, Union Beach and Marlboro and the Western Monmouth Utilities Authority. This notice is also posted in the lobby of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority Administration Building.

Secretary Khachaturian asked all in attendance to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence for the safety of US Troops all over the world.

Secretary Khachaturian requested a roll call of attendance:

Mr. Fischer welcomed Mr. Scott Whalen, the new Commissioner from Hazlet and invited him to a tour of the plant at his convenience.

Reports

- 1. Executive Director's Report Projects, Special Reports & Connection Applications Robert Fischer Reported:
 - Stone Hill Contractor Niro Project Payment Application #11 in the amount of \$1,582,946.90. Project stands at 80% completion. Payment request was reviewed by Hazen & Sawyer and BRSA Staff & recommends payment.

- NE Remsco Contractor Pump Station Project Payment Application #8 in the amount of \$244,401.22. Project stands at 60% completion. Payment request reviewed by PSS and BRSA Staff & recommends payment.
- Shorelands Contractor Various Authority Buildings Payment Application #6 in the amount of \$86,702.26. Project stands at 80% completion. Payment request reviewed by R3M and BRSA Staff & recommends payment.

Minus the above mentioned payment Phase I project payments total \$15,431,049.28 which 61% or \$9,339,040.09 is FEMA reimbursable. The remainder is in a short term note which will convert to a Long term note and it will become a Debt Service over a 20 year period.

- We advertised and received bids for the Combined Blower Building Project.
- EPA changed the date for final compliance with SSI incinerator regulations for 2 facilities in the U.S. (East Bank WWTP in Louisiana and the BRSA). The compliance date was March 21, 2016 now changed to March 21, 2017. According to the latest report from Stone Hill they will be running a stack test in August on the restoration and upgrade of the Niro Incinerator.

2. Staff Engineer's Report

Pete Canal Reported:

- Primary Clarifiers #3&4 Repair-Contract #86-award contract to MBE Mark III Electric, Inc. in the amount of \$428,927.00. There were 6 bidders and MBE Mark III Electric was the lowest responsible bidder. MBE is currently doing work on the NIRO. Recommend award
- West Keansburg Pump Station Odor & Corrosion Control-Contract #90-seeking authorization to advertise this project.
- Seaview Gardens Apartments in Keansburg-requesting refund of \$92,400 in phase I connection fee. Property sold, paperwork from new owners requested and cancellation of TWA was received from the DEP. Send to Conflict Attorney for Resolution.
- Change Order #2 for NE Remsco-Pump Station Project-not to exceed \$204,556 for additional work which is being sent for FEMA reimbursement and NJEIT approval.
- Change Order #4 for Stone Hill Contractor-Niro Project-not to exceed \$388,482.71 for addition work which \$375,256.71 is being sent for FEMA reimbursement. Change Order was sent to NJEIT for approval.

Ed Barboe and John Wojnas from Hazen and Sawyer presented a power point illustration explaining the scope changes for the restoration and mitigation of the NIRO project-Change Order #4-Stone Hill Contractor.

• Combined Blower Building- bids were opened on May 13, 2016 - received one bid from Stone Hill Contracting in the amount of \$6,158,180 and recommend award. We had sold 4 or 5 bids, about 5 sub-contractors came and reviewed the bid and 4 contractors came to the pre-bid meeting. We were anticipating 2 or 3 bids however this project has several phases and is complex which may have caused contractors not to bid.

Pete said he and Hazen contacted several contractors and being there is a lot of work out there, contractors are being very selective. This is an 8 phase project, very complicated which probably scared contractors away. Stone Hill knows the plant, they have been a good contractor and we feel confident they will do a good job. The bid required contractors to list specific equipment and Stone Hill will be supplying the specified equipment.

3. Consulting Engineer – R3M

Manuel Ponte Reported:

- Various Authority Buildings Project is 80% complete
- Standby Generator #2 & 3 have been repaired and #1 is under way now. Generator's #2 & 3 have been tested successfully. The radiator for Generator #1 is being replaced this week and we expect a completion sometime in June.

Mr. Fischer asked Manuel if they ran a load test. Manuel said they did on 2 generators.

Mr. Fischer asked Manuel to explain what a load test is. Manuel said they have a portable load bank and test each generator at various loads up to 100% load.

Pete said that with the Power Distribution Project we will be getting new load banks and will be able to lead test more often.

• First Two Quarters Flow Report – September 30, 2015 to March 30, 2016 – all flow numbers are aligned with previous quarters and there are no unusual items to report.

4. Superintendent's Report

Mike Broyles Reported:

- The flow is on a downward trend
- Effluent continuing to improve
- 4 odor complaints in April all from 705 9th Street
- Dorr Oliver was taken off line, fuel guns bending down, fluidization was poor. Did not burn from April 29th to May 7th. Six of those days we had Spectraserv take out two loads per day. We went back to burn on May 8th.
- Safety Incentive Program possible award of Safety Incentive Day for 2 employees who participated and earned enough points in the program. Mike explained the point system.

Mr. Fischer explained the Reconciliation Report shows General Ledger vs. Bank Statements. All reconciled in each account. This report is generated quarterly and is an internal control procedure.

WHEREAS, six (6) bids were received and the lowest bidder being MBE Mark III Electric Inc. of Madison, NJ at a price of \$428,927, and

WHEREAS, the bid was reviewed by the Authority's Attorney, Staff Engineer and Certified Purchasing Agent and found to be acceptable; and

WHEREAS, funds are available for this project.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Sandy severely damaged the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority (Authority) buildings and processes on October 29, 2012 requiring engineering services for design of restoration and mitigation of these buildings and processes, and

WHEREAS, Hazen & Sawyer Engineering (H&S) of NY was awarded the design of the Restoration & Mitigation of the Combined Blower Building Project on May 18, 2015 via Resolution No. 64/15, and

WHEREAS, the Combined Blower Building Project will be funded through the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Loans (NJEIT) and partially reimbursed through FEMA, and

WHEREAS, the Combined Blower Building Project design documents were submitted to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) for Authorization to Advertise public bids, and

WHEREAS, the Authority approved Resolution No. 42/16 authorizing the staff and consulting engineer, H&S to prepare specifications and advertise a Public Contract, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Local Public Contracts Law, the AUTHORITY advertised for Combined Blower Building Project, Contract 80-S and one sealed bid was received and publically opened on May 13, 2016 at 1pm EST, for a price of \$6,158,180 by Stone Hill Contracting Co., Inc. (SHC) of Doylestown, PA, and

WHEREAS, the Authority consulting engineer, H&S, general counsel and staff, have reviewed the bid and recommend award to SHC in the amount of \$6,158,180, subject to NJDEP authorization to award, and

WHEREAS, on April 18, 2016, the Authority authorized the issuance of project notes in connection with the NJEIT, who is providing funding for this project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The Commissioners of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority hereby award the Contract to Stone Hill Contracting Co., Inc of Doylestown, PA in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents, in the amount not to exceed \$6,158,180, subject to receiving Authorization to Award from NJDEP.

WHEREAS, the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority (Authority) needs to perform repairs & mitigation on the NIRO Incinerator due to damages caused by Hurricane Sandy; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Local Public Contract Laws, Contract 74-S NIRO Incinerator Repairs and Mitigation was awarded to Stone Hill Contracting Company, Inc. (SHC) on February 23, 2015 for a total price of \$16,445,997 via Resolution 35/15; and
