Frequently Asked Questions

Question: With the toilet paper shortage, can I use flushable wipes?

Answer: Flushable wipes should never be flushed even if the product labels it is safe to flush. Flushable wipes cause blockages and backups. If you are out of toilet paper and need to use flushable wipes, it is advised to dispose of them in the trash and to not flush them.
